PURPOSE:

The Central Region's contract management unit is seeking approval to amend contract agreement GJL58 with Embrace Families Community Based Care, Inc. and insert the schedule of funds dated 07/01/21, update the Quality Assurance language, add the fiscal year 21-22 adoption targets and the Division X Chafee Funds language.

BACKGROUND:

The Department has a contract in place with Embrace Families Community Based Care, Inc., pursuant to section 287.057(5) Florida Statutes. The Department withdrew Invitation to Negotiate 07FSS1804 and negotiated pursuant to an Exceptional Purchase, after receipt of less than two responsive bids/proposals/replies. This purchase is exempt by law from the requirements for competitive procurement. Contract GJL58 provides foster care and related community-based care services in the Central Region, pursuant to Sections 409.988 and 409.986(1)(a), Florida Statutes. The contract provides services to children and families located in Circuit 9 – Orange and Osceola Counties; and Circuit 18 - Seminole County.

KEY PROVISIONS:

Amendment 8 incorporates the following changes: Inserts the Schedule of Funds for FY21-22 dated 7/1/2021 (Attachment II-C) and revises the total contract amount from \$391,812,989.00 to \$396,738,386.00. Updates the Quality Assurance language (Section 1.5.4). Adds the Adoption Target for Fiscal Year 2021-2022 of 234, and the Division X Chafee Funds language (Section 5.14).

Effective the latter August 1, 2021 or the last date of the signatories, this amends the above referenced Contract as follows:

- 1. In Legacy Standard Contract, Section 3, and Attachment I, 4.1.1, last addressed in Amendment #0007 the amount \$391,812,989.00, is replaced with \$396,738,386.00.
- 2. The highlighted portions below amend Attachment I, 1.5.4. The non-highlighted portion is illustrative and is unaffected by this Amendment.

1.5.4 Quality Assurance (QA) and Continuous Quality Improvement(CQI)

The Lead Agency is responsible for the quality of services provided directly by the Lead Agency and services provided by sub-contracted agencies and the direct service providers with which the Lead Agency has a direct contractual relationship. The Lead Agency shall operate a comprehensive QA/CQI program to address oversight and accountability of the child welfare services continuum. The Lead Agency shall ensure there is capacity and resources to sustain ongoing CQI processes, including designated CQI staff. All activities shall comply with the most recent version of the Department's Operating Procedure for Quality Reviews to fulfill the Department requirements for a comprehensive CQI system (see Exhibit A). The guidelines for completing case reviews will be updated as necessary and posted on the Quality Improvement page of the University of South Florida's Center for Child Welfare website. If the Lead Agency objects to implementation of a new provision of an element of the Department's Operating Procedures for Quality Reviews, the Chief Executive Officer shall, within 30 days of receipt of Department notice thereof, identify in writing the basis for such objection which shall include the impact to the provision of services for all children or increased financial obligation that cannot be met. The Department will respond to such objection within thirty (30) days of receipt. If the Department determines that it will still seek implementation of the contested provision, the Lead Agency may seek review by the Quality Review Director. If the parties do not agree to the resolution, the issue may be escalated to the Chief Quality Officer, who will be the final decisionmaker on the issue.

- **1.5.4.1** The Lead Agency shall attend quarterly meetings and monthly conference calls with the Department to collaborate on federal and state QA and CQI initiatives. The Lead Agency shall notify the contract manager of any meetings conducted under this section with a list of attendees.
- **1.5.4.2** The Lead Agency agrees to collaborate in special reviews as deemed necessary by both parties.
- **1.5.4.3** The Lead Agency agrees to require new QA reviewers to attend QA Training within six months of hire.

6. Attachment I, Section 5, is amended to add:

5.16. Division X Chafee Funds

The Lead Agency shall utilize the allocated Chafee Division X funding for specific, allowable expenses. Distribution of this allocation will be paid to the Lead Agency in one supplemental payment. Upon execution of this contract amendment, the Lead Agency shall request payment of the total allocation.

- 5.16.1 Request for payment shall be made through a proper invoice per Attachment I, Section 4.3.1. Monthly expenditures for the use of these funds shall be reported as described in Attachment I, Sections 4.3.1.1 (Exhibit B), 4.3.1.4 (Exhibit B), and 4.3.1.5 (Exhibit B).
- 5.16.2 Any funding not spent by February 28, 2022 will be returned to the Department by March 21, 2022 so that the Department may re-allocate these Chafee Funds to CBC Lead Agencies who may need additional funds to ensure service delivery for youth and young adults. Division X Chafee Funds are available until exhausted.

The cost pools assigned and the amount for each cost pool will be provided in the Lead Agency State Fiscal Year 2021-2022 Schedule of Funds.

- 5.16.3 All payments for and/or directly benefiting youth and young adults shall be processed/documented in the Florida Safe Families Network (FSFN), except for the allocation amount specifically identified for campaigning to provide awareness and outreach to youth and young adults.
- 5.16.4 Allowable expenditures and the required documentation for the use of these funds are described in the Division X Chafee and Chafee ETV Federal Funds Allowable Expenditures and Documentation Guide document, which is incorporated by reference.
